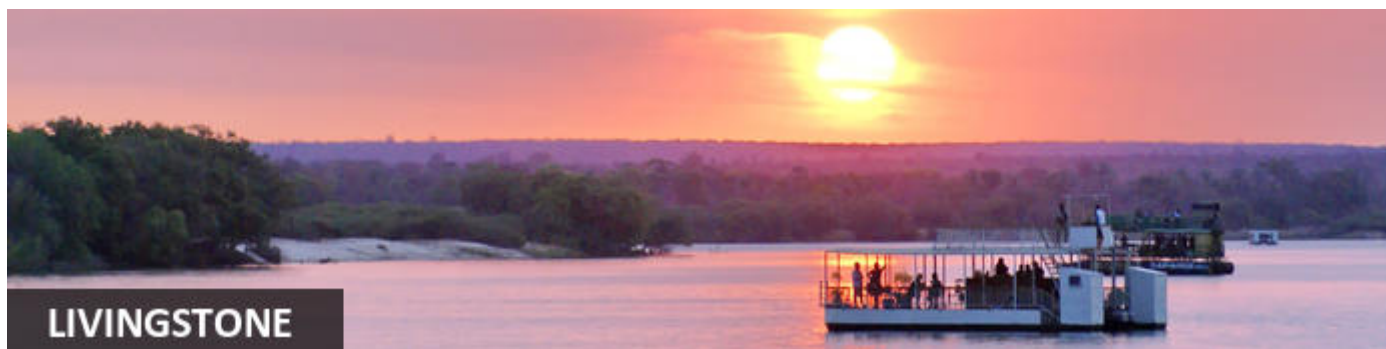

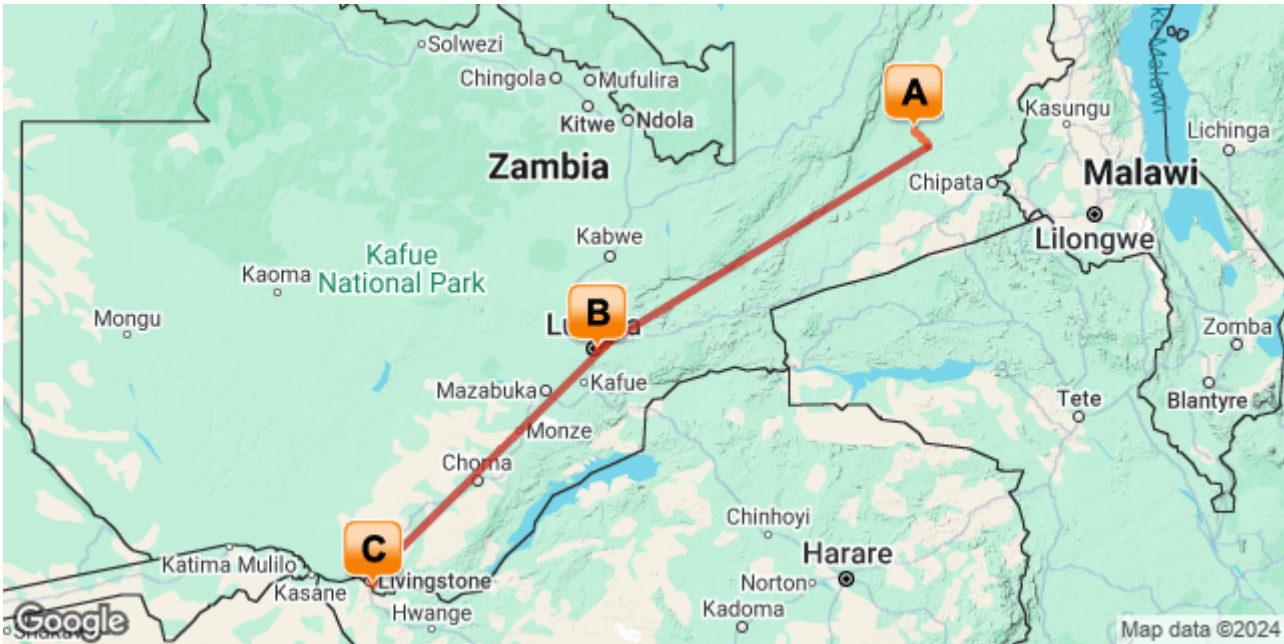

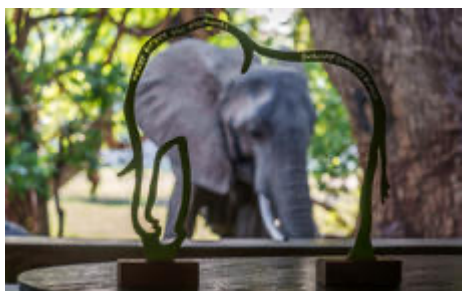
The Directors House has two adjoining rooms with a private garden and swimming pool.

Mfuwe Lodge is open all year and all age groups are welcome!

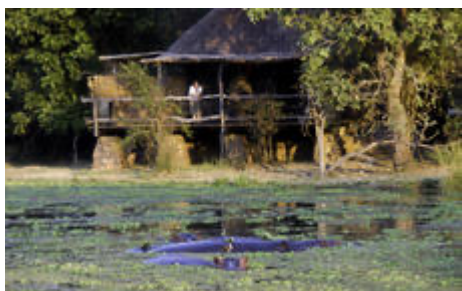


Mfuwe Lodge Chalets

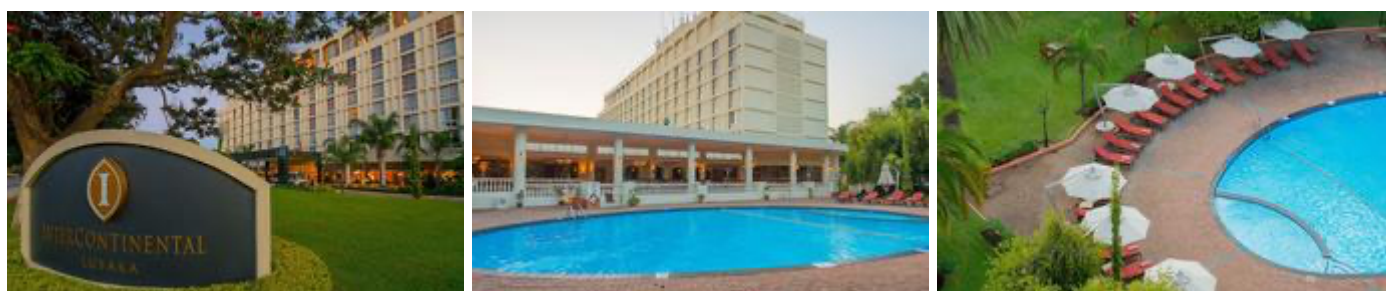

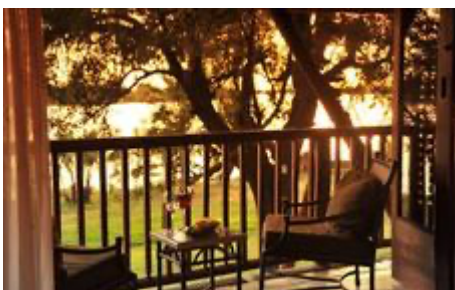

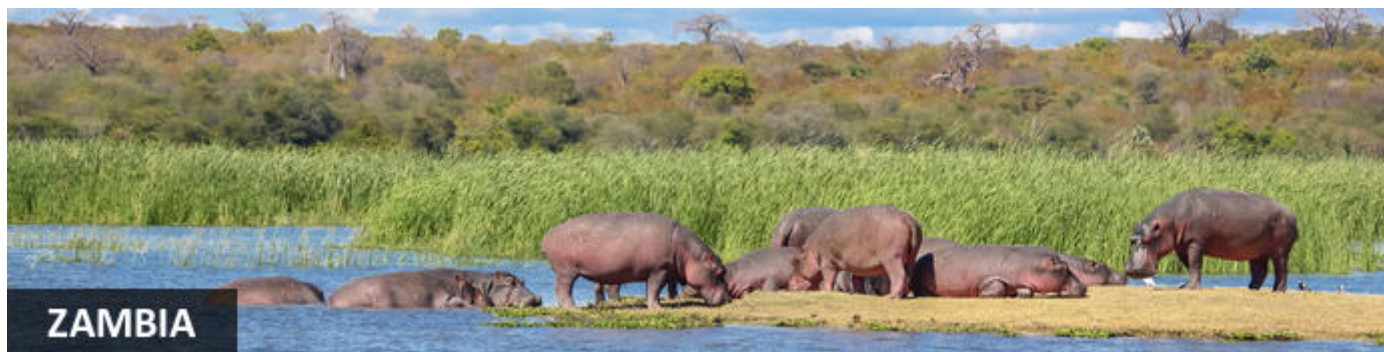
